

## TERMS & CONDITIONS

**REBATE OFFER:** This rebate program covers equipment purchased and installed in 2010. Details of this program, including rebate levels, are subject to change without notice.

**ELIGIBILITY:** Rebates through this program are available to Green Mountain Power residential electric customers in Vermont.

**ELIGIBLE EQUIPMENT:** Review the equipment eligibility requirements on pages 1 and 2 to ensure eligibility before completing this form.

**PROOFS OF PURCHASE:** Sales receipt or invoice itemizing the new equipment and indicating the size, type, make, model, serial number (where applicable), purchase date and vendor must accompany each rebate application.

**PAYMENT:** Equipment must be purchased and installed before payment is issued. Falsifying any information may lead to cancellation of this and future rebate applications, a claim by Efficiency Vermont for the return of any rebate, and/or referral for prosecution. Allow 45 days for delivery of payment. Submitting an application with incomplete or missing information may delay check processing and delivery. Efficiency Vermont will not pay more than 100% of the material purchase price shown on the invoice.

**APPROVAL & VERIFICATION:** Efficiency Vermont reserves the right to verify sales transactions and to inspect all installations.

**TAX LIABILITY:** Efficiency Vermont is not responsible for any tax liability imposed on the customer as a result of rebate payment.

**DISPOSAL:** The customer/contractor is responsible for the proper disposal/recycling of any waste generated as a result of this project, including the disposal of refrigerant.

**ENDORSEMENT:** Efficiency Vermont does not endorse any particular manufacturers, products, or system designs in promoting this program. Equivalent products must be pre-approved by Efficiency Vermont.

**SAFETY & BUILDING CODES:** The customer/contractor agrees that each measure complies with all federal, state, and local safety, building, and environmental codes. All products must be UL-listed and installed per manufacturer's instructions.

**CONFIDENTIALITY:** All customer, vendor, and/or contractor information supplied to Efficiency Vermont will be kept confidential and will not be shared with any person or organization.

**CAPACITY CREDITS/ENVIRONMENTAL CREDITS:** In accepting these financial incentives, the customer agrees that Efficiency Vermont and/or Green Mountain Power holds the sole rights to any electric system capacity credits and/or environmental credits associated with the energy efficiency measures for which incentives have been received. These credits will be used for the benefit of Vermont ratepayers.

**Please note:** Oil or propane furnaces with high efficiency electric fan motors eligible for this rebate must be purchased and installed between January 1, 2010 and December 31, 2010. The rebate application must be received by January 7, 2011.

## Furnace Fan Motor Rebate Application

**Green Mountain Power Energy Efficiency Fund (the Fund):**

Green Mountain Power created the Fund in March 2007 and plans to invest more than \$8 million in energy efficiency and renewable energy by the end of 2012. The goal of the Fund is to maximize financial and environmental benefits for our residential, commercial and industrial customers primarily through investments in energy efficiency.

**Furnace Rebate:**

The Fund is offering a rebate on high efficiency oil and propane furnaces with efficient electric fan motors. These high efficiency electric fan motors use less energy than standard motors. The rebate is available on replacement furnaces (heating through forced hot air) using oil or propane. However, it is not available on replacement boilers (heating through baseboard hot water) or systems using natural gas (other rebates are available for Vermont Gas customers).

Eligible systems are ducted, forced-air furnaces less than 225,000 BTU/h in size that meet the ENERGY STAR® requirements noted in the table below and contain a high-efficiency, brushless, permanent magnet fan motor (e.g., BPM, ECM, and ICM). **How to apply for the Green Mountain Power rebate:**

**If you are replacing your existing furnace with a new furnace with a high efficiency electric fan motor, please review the rebate chart below and fill out the rebate application on page 3.**

**If you are considering switching your heating fuel source, we suggest that you:**

- call oil, propane and natural gas fuel providers in your area to see if they can provide service to your home.
- ask the fuel provider to estimate the cost to convert your current system to a new system with a different fuel source and the cost per unit of the fuel you are considering.
- use a fuel cost comparison calculator to complete a cost comparison between various fuel sources. A fuel cost comparison calculator is available online at [www.greenmountainpower.com](http://www.greenmountainpower.com) (under the Energy and Education tab).
- review the chart below to determine the rebate amount available for the system you are considering.
- determine if your annual fuel savings are worth the initial investment, after incentives are applied, for changing fuel types.

\*AFUE stands for Annual Fuel Utilization Efficiency. The AFUE is the most widely used measure of a furnace's heating efficiency. An AFUE of 90 means that approximately 90 percent of the fuel is utilized to provide warmth to your home, while the remaining 10 percent escapes as exhaust.
